## **OPENING OF THE MEETING**

1. The meeting was opened by Carlos Manuel Rodriguez, Chief Executive Officer/Chairperson of the Facility. Richard Bontjer, Council Member for the Constituency of Australia, New Zealand, and Republic of Korea, had been designated as Elected Chairperson for the calendar year 2025 by decision 53/2024 adopted on December 20, 2024.
2. The Chairperson and the Elected Chairperson made opening statements to the Council.

3. The Council adopted the provisional agenda set forth in document GEF/C.69/01-Rev.2

## **RELATIONS WITH THE CONVENTIONS AND OTHER INTERNATIONAL INSTITUTIONS**

4. Mr. Simon Stiell, Executive Secretary of the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC); Mr. Rolph Poyet, Executive Secretary of the Basel, Rotterdam, and Stockholm Conventions; Ms. Monika Stankiewicz, Executive Secretary of the Minamata Convention on Mercury; Ms. Louise Baker, Managing Director, UN Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD); Mr. Vladimir Jares Director, DOALOS/OLA, Biodiversity Beyond National Jurisdiction (BBNJ); Mr. Yibin Zhang, Programme Management Officer, Convention on Biological Diversity addressed the Council. In addition, Ms. Ivonne Higuero, Secretary-General, Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) also addressed the Council.

Agency: CAF; GEF Project Financing: \$9,100,000; Co-financing: \$111,600,000.
17. **Regional (Philippines, Indonesia, Malaysia).** *Sulu-Sulawesi Seascape Approach to Coral Reef Livelihoods (SEACONNECT)* (GEF ID 11528). Agency: CI; GEF Project Financing: \$6,000,000; Co-financing: \$49,240,400.

22. With respect to the following project, the Council requested the Secretariat to arrange for Council members to receive draft final project documents and to transmit to the CEO within four weeks any concerns they may have prior to the CEO's endorsing the project document for final approval by the GEF Agency:

23. **Global (Chile, India, Mexico, Peru, South Africa, Zambia)** *Global elimination of mercury in non-ferrous metals initiative – GEMINI (GEF ID 11892)*. Agency: UNIDO, UNDP, UNEP; GEF Project Financing: \$58,810,000; Co-financing: \$383,180,000

24. With respect to the PIFs and PFDs approved as part of the Work Program, the Council finds that each of these PIFs and PFDs (i) is, or would be, consistent with the Instrument and GEF policies and procedures, and (ii) may be endorsed by the CEO for final approval by the GEF Agency, provided that the final project documents fully incorporate and address the Council's and the STAP reviewer's comments on the Work Program, and that the CEO confirms that the project continues to be consistent with the Instrument and GEF policies and procedures.

25. With respect to any PIF approved in this Work Program, the final project document will be posted on the GEF website for information after CEO endorsement. If there are major changes to the project objectives or scope since PIF approval, the final project document shall be posted on the web for Council review for four weeks prior to CEO endorsement.

**Decision 5/2025**

*GEF Business Plan and Corporate Budget for FY26*

26. The Council, having considered document GEF/C.69/03, *GEF Business Plan and Corporate Budget for FY26*, takes note of the business plan, and approves an FY26 corporate budget from the GEF Trust Fund of US\$45.306 million, comprised of:

- (a) US\$36.069 million for the GEF Secretariat, of which US\$2 million will be paid from GEF-7 administrative budget underruns
- (b) US\$1.7 million for the GEF Secretariat for the Special Initiative to fund the Organization of the Eighth Assembly, anticipated for June 2026
- (c) US\$3.140 million for STAP; and
- (d) US\$4.397 million for the Trustee

27. The Council also approves a total FY26 administrative budget for the Nagoya Protocol Implementation Fund (NPIF) of US\$22,200, comprised of the following allocations from the NPIF to cover the Secretariat's and Trustee's expenses for NPIF administration and implementation:

- (a) US\$17,500 for the GEF Secretariat; and
- (b) US\$4,700 for the Trustee

28. The Council also approves a total FY26 administrative budget for the Capacity Building Initiative for Transparency (CBIT) from the CBIT Trust Fund of US\$0.310 million, comprised of:

- (a) US\$0.287 million for the GEF Secretariat; and
- (b) US\$0.023 million for the Trustee

29. The Council requests the Secretariat, in consultation with STAP and the Trustee, to present a combined FY27 corporate budget and business plan for discussion at its June 2026 meeting.

**Decision 6/2025**

*GEF-8 Midterm Review on Performance of Full Flexibility*

30. The Council, having considered document GEF/C.69/04 *GEF-8 Midterm Review on Performance of Full Flexibility*, welcomes the report and requests the GEF Secretariat to continue monitoring the use of full flexibility in GEF-8.

**Decision 7/2025**

*Strength of the Partnership: Coverage by Agencies*

31. The Council, having considered document, GEF/C.69/05/Rev.1, *Strengthening the GEF*

*Partnership: Options for Agency Expansion*, takes notes of the document and decides to:

- (a) Request the Secretariat to prepare for the adoption of a targeted expansion approach in GEF-9, to potentially add up to three additional Agencies, with a focus on LDCs and SIDS.
- (b) Agree on the minimum eligibility criteria for Stage 1 of the expansion process.
- (c) Request the Secretariat to conduct a gap analysis of fiduciary standards, environmental and social safeguards (ESS), gender mainstreaming policies, and stakeholder engagement across Global Environment Facility (GEF), Green Climate Fund (GCF), and Adaptation Fund (AF) to assess the feasibility of a fast-track approach. Based on the findings, the Secretariat will propose finalized expansion procedures for consideration at the 71<sup>st</sup> Council Meeting (June 2026).

**Decision 8/2025**

*Relations with Conventions & Other International Institutions*

32. The Council, having considered document GEF/C.68/06/Rev.1, *Relations with the Conventions and Other International Institutions*, welcomes the report and requests the GEF network to continue to work with recipient countries to reflect the guidance and national priorities in their GEF programming and activities.

**Decision 9/2025**

*GEF IEO Annual Performance Report 2025*

33. The Council, having considered document, GEF/E/C.69/01, *GEF IEO Annual Performance Report 2025*, takes notes of the document and the recommendation and encourages the Agencies to complete and submit terminal evaluations within the timeline specified in the terminal evaluation guidelines.

**Decision 10/2025**

*Evaluation of International Waters Focal Area and Management Response*

34. The Council, having considered document GEF/E/C.69/02 *Evaluation of the International Waters Focal Area*, and GEF/C.69/07, *the Management Response*, takes note of the related evaluation recommendations and endorses the management response to address them.

**Decision 11/2025**

*Evaluation Socioeconomic Co-Benefits of GEF-Funded Interventions and Management Response*

35. The Council, having considered document GEF/E/C.69/03, *Evaluation of the Socioeconomic Co-benefits of GEF-Funded Interventions*, and GEF/C.69/08, *the Management Response*, takes note of the related evaluation recommendations and endorses the management response to address them.

**Decision 12/2025**                      *Evaluation of GEF Support for Nature-Based Solutions and Management Response*

36. The Council, having considered document GEF/E/C.69/04 *Evaluation of the GEF support for nature-based solutions*, and GEF/C.69/09, the *Management Response*, takes note of the related evaluation recommendations and endorses the management response to address them.

**Decision 13/2025**                      *FY26 Work Program and Budget of the Independent Evaluation Office*                      E

37. The Council, having considered document GEF/E/C.69/05, *FY 2026 Work Program and Budget of the Independent Evaluation Office*, acknowledges the progress made by the Global Environment Facility Independent Evaluation Office (GEF IEO) in the reporting period. The Council approves the annual IEO budget for FY 2026 for a total of \$ 7.891 million, which includes the 11 percent indirect overhead charge in accordance with the decision made by the GEF Council at its 64<sup>th</sup> Session in June 2023

**Decision 14/2025**                      *Draft Amendments to the Memorandum of Understanding between the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations*

38. The Council, having considered document GEF/C.69/10, *Draft Amendments to the Memorandum of Understanding between the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change and the Council of the Global Environment Facility*:

- a) Approves the draft amendments, as reflected in the Amended Memorandum of Understanding between the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change and the Council of the Global Environment Facility, contained in Annex 1.
- b) Requests the Secretariat of the Global Environment Facility to transmit its approval to the Conference of the Parties.

**Decision 15/2025**                      *Report of the Selection and Review Committee: Assessment of CEO and Director of IEO*

39. The Council having considered document GEF/C.69/11, *Report of the Selection and Review Committee (SRC)*:

- a) Agrees with the SRC's assessment of the GEF CEO's performance for Fiscal Year 25 (July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025) and its recommended performance rating. The World Bank will provide its standard salary increase, in accordance with the World Bank's Merit Increase Matrix. The Council requests the SRC to communicate this decision to the World Bank Human Resource Department.
- b) Agrees with the SRC's assessment of the GEF IEO Director's performance for Fiscal Year 25 (July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025) and its recommended performance rating. The World Bank will

provide the standard salary increase, in accordance with the World Bank's Merit Increase Matrix. The Council requests the SRC to communicate this decision to the World Bank Human Resource Department.

- c) Agrees with the proposed FY26 performance objectives for the GEF CEO and the IEO Director.

**Decision 16/2025**     *Report of the Selection and Review Committee: Appointment of New SRC Members*

40. The Council having considered document GEF/C.69/11, *Report of the Selection and Review Committee (SRC)*, endorses the following new SRC members:

- 1) Mr. Maher Abdelrahim, representing Afghanistan, Jordan, Iraq, Lebanon, Pakistan, Syria and Yemen, replacing Ms. Qongqong Hoohlo, representing Angola, Botswana, Eswatini, Lesotho, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa, Zambia, Zimbabwe;
- 2) Ambassador Filipo Tarakinikini, representing Cook Islands, Fiji, Kiribati, Marshall Islands, Micronesia, Nauru, Niue, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Timor Leste, Tonga, Tuvalu, Vanuatu, replacing Ms. Hongxia Li, former Council Member representing China; and
- 3) Ms. Regina Rosales Talamas, representing Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Venezuela replacing Laura Aguirre, former Council Member of the same Constituency.

41. Endorses the prolongation of the other members of the SRC to ensure continuity, while noting the importance of rotation and inclusion of multiple constituencies and geographies.

42. Decides to review the procedure for identifying and proposing new members of the SRC for consideration at the 70<sup>th</sup> GEF Council meeting.

**Decision 17/2025**     *Policy Amendments to Streamline the GEF Project Cycle*

43. The Council, having considered document GEF/C.69/12, *Policy Amendments to Streamline the GEF Project Cycle*, approves the proposed amendments to the *Project and Program Cycle Policy* (OP/PL/01), the *Project Cancellation Policy* (OP/PL/02), the *Policy on Minimum Fiduciary Standards* (GA/PL/02), the *Fee Policy for GEF Partner Agencies* (FI/PL/03) and the *Policy on Monitoring* (GEF/C.56/03/Rev.01), as set out in Annexes I, II, III, IV and V.

44. The updated policies will be effective July 1, 2025, and will remain in effect until amended or superseded by the Council.

**Decision 18/2025**     *Other Business: Change of Constituency*

45. The GEF Council welcomes the decision of the Constituency of Cambodia, Korea DPR, Lao

PDR, Malaysia, Mongolia, Myanmar, Thailand, Viet Nam to include Indonesia and the Philippines in their Constituency.

**Decision 19/2025**      *Other Business: Offer of the Government of Uzbekistan to host the Eighth GEF Assembly*

46.      The Council expressed its appreciation to the Government of Uzbekistan for offering to host the Eighth GEF Assembly and the 71st GEF Council Meeting during the week commencing May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2026 in Samarkand, and accepted this kind offer.

**Decision 20/2025**      *Other Business: Dates for the 71<sup>st</sup> and 72<sup>nd</sup> Council Meetings*

47.      The Council decides that it will hold its 71<sup>st</sup> GEF Council back-to-back with the Eighth GEF Assembly the week commencing May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2026 in Uzbekistan in a hybrid format; and the 72<sup>nd</sup> meeting the week of December 14, 2026 in a virtual modality.
